# **RESOLUTION 78-0819 SOLAR FEES**

Be it hereby resolved to increase the residential solar energy generation permit application fee from twenty dollars (\$20) to fifty dollars (\$50); and also

Be it resolved to establish a commercial solar energy generation permit application fee of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750). These fees are to be established immediately.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes; motion carried.

Councilman Martin made the following motion, seconded by Councilwoman Szozda:

# **RESOLUTION 79-0819 ACCEPTING APPLICATION REQUESTING MODIFICATION TO THE COTTAGES AT TROUTBURG WPDD**

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of Kendall, New York desires to consider the application by The Cottages at Troutburg to modify Local Law 2 of 2012 <u>A LOCAL LAW AMENDING</u> <u>THE TOWN OF KENDALL ZONING MAP TO CREATE A WATERFRONT PLANNED</u> <u>DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (WPDD) PURSUANT TO LOCAL LAW 1 OF 2012</u> of the Town of Kendall to allow for non-wind generated alternative energy systems (solar) as a permitted accessory use within the WPDD, and

WHEREAS, Jack Howitt of Midlakes Development and Construction LTD, regarding the Cottages at Troutburg, has met with the Town Board at its work session to review his plans, and has submitted fourteen copies of his letter of intent, of the map indicating the location of the proposed solar energy system, and of the Long Form Environmental Assessment Form as required for modifying an existent WPDD according to Local Law 1 of 2012 <u>AUTHORIZING THE CREATION OF</u> WATERFRONT PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICTS IN THE TOWN OF KENDALL, so then

**BE IT RESOLVED,** to accept this application as complete, and upon payment of fee being received by the Town Clerk, (and upon approval of the application by the Attorney for the Town and the Engineer for the Town as to form and content)\*, this application will be referred to the Town of Kendall Planning Board for its review and recommendations.

Discussion: Councilman Newell asked what constitutes a complete application, and whether it can be modified after filing. Attorney Meier said if there are changes made, it will be considered a new application. Councilman Newell said he was under the impression that there were changes to be made on the SEQR portion of the submission. Supervisor Cammarata said that is true, and that several small changes need to be made. The attorney suggested adding the wording in blue above (\*), so that when the corrections are made, the resubmission should be re-dated but not re-charged. CEO Hennekey suggested the application not be considered complete until the changes are made. The Board decided to vote, with the phrase added, notwithstanding the expected changes. An amended motion was not made, but the intent to amend it due to discussion is assumed.

Supervisor Cammarata called for a vote, resulting in all ayes; motion carried.
